



Dear parents and carers,

Your child has been learning about fire safety at school. Please ask your child the questions below to see what they have learnt and find out how you can keep your family safe.

1) What is a smoke alarm?

You should have at least one working smoke alarm on each floor of your home. Make sure everyone knows what it sounds like and what to do if you hear it.

2) What should I do if there is a fire?

Shout – tell everyone

Get out

Stay out

Get the fire and rescue service out

3) What number do I dial to get help on the telephone if there is a fire?

999 and ask for the fire and rescue service.

4) Where should matches and lighters be kept?

Please help keep children safe by keeping any matches and lighters out of children's reach.

5) Who should wear a seatbelt in the car?

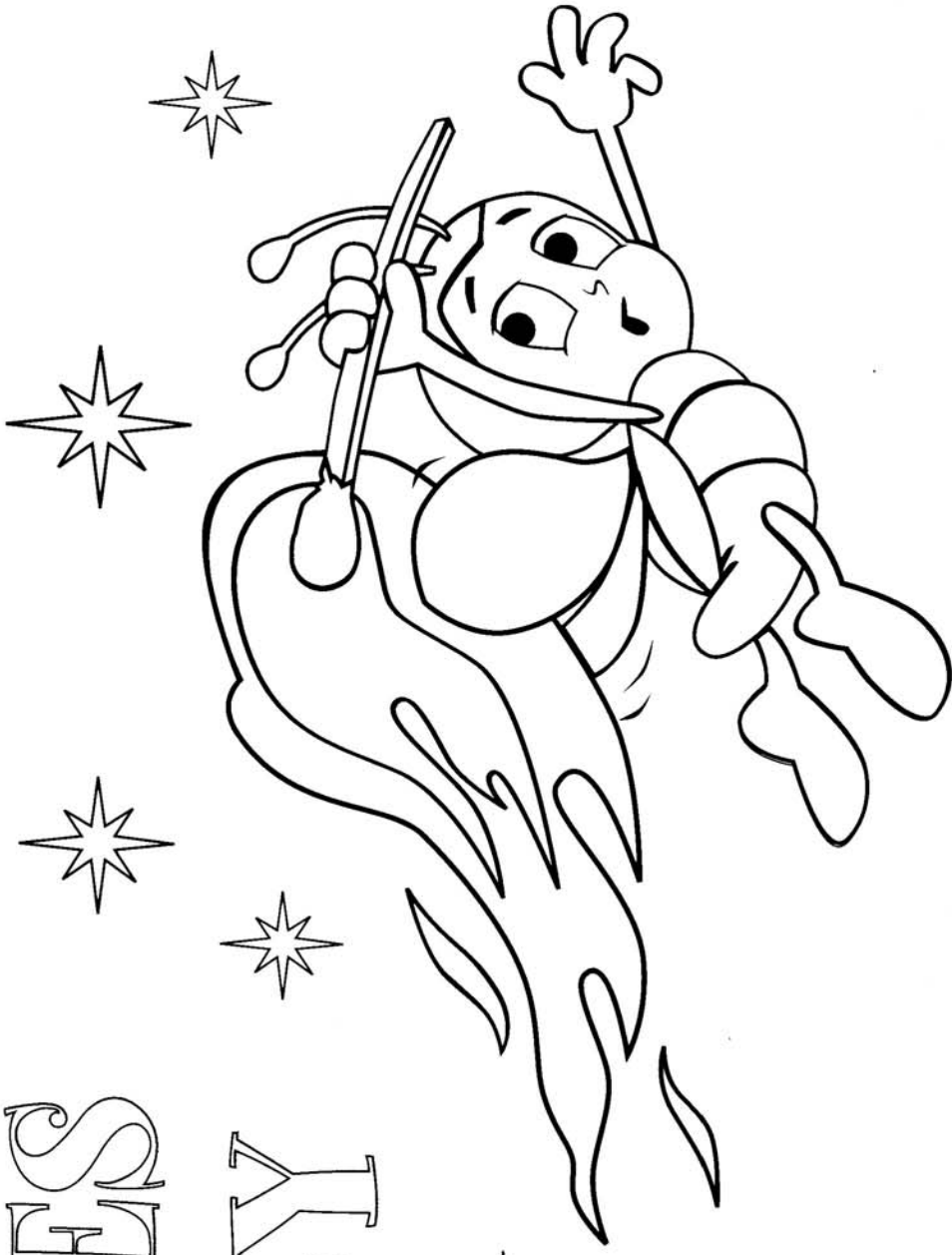
Everyone.

Everyone should use appropriate restraints (such as seatbelts, booster seats, child seats and booster cushions) even on short journeys. It is the driver's responsibility to check all children under 14 years old are wearing appropriate restraints.

From September 2006 all children under 12 and also under 135cm tall are required to use appropriate child restraints such as booster cushions and booster seats.
